

Narrative Lectionary 2023-24

Readings for Year 2 (Mark)

The **preaching texts** are always listed first. During the fall, Old Testament texts are the primary vehicle for proclaiming the biblical story. The gospel readings become primary texts on the Fourth Sunday of Advent. A brief accompanying reading (selected from one of the gospels before Christmas and after Easter; selected from Psalms from Christmas through Easter) is noted in parentheses. *These accompanying readings are optional.*

September	17	NL202 Isaac Born to Sarah Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost	Genesis 18:1-15; 21:1-7 The promise of Isaac's birth to an aged Sarah and Abraham brings laughter <i>(Mark 10:27)</i>
September	24	NL203 Jacob Wrestles God Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost	Genesis 32:[9-13] 22-30 Jacob wrestles with an angel. Receives the name Israel, for he strives with God <i>(Mark 14:32-36)</i>
October	1	NL204 Moses and God's Name Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost	Exodus 1:8-14 [1:15—2:10]; 3:1-15 Israel is in slavery and calls for help. God calls Moses to bring release <i>(Mark 12:26-27a)</i>
October	8	NL205 Hear O Israel Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost	Deuteronomy 5:1-21; 6:4-9 Ten Commandments Love the LORD your God with all your heart and soul and might <i>(Mark 12:28-31)</i>
October	15	NL206 Ruth Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost	Ruth 1:1-17 [4:13-17] Ruth is a foreigner who finds belonging among God's people. "Where you go I will go, your people will be my people, your God will be my God." <i>(Mark 3:33-35)</i>

October	29	NL208 Kingdom Divided Twenty-second Sunday after Pentecost	1 Kings 12:1-17, 25-29 Rehoboam and the need for servant leadership; the kingdom is divided <i>(Mark 10:42-45)</i>
November	5	NL209 Elijah at Mount Carmel Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost	1 Kings 18:[17-19] 20-39 Elijah calls fire from heaven on Mount Carmel to reveal God's presence <i>(Mark 9:2-4)</i>
November	12	NL210 Hosea Twenty-fourth Sunday after Pentecost	Hosea 11:1-9 God's passionate love for his children; despite their disobedience he cannot give them up. <i>(Mark 10:13-14)</i>
November	19	NL211 Isaiah's Vineyard Song Twenty-fifth Sunday after Pentecost	Isaiah 5:1-7; 11:1-5 Israel is pictured as a vineyard. God looks for the fruit of righteousness but finds only injustice. God promises a faithful king who will judge with righteousness. <i>(Mark 12:1-3)</i>
November	26	NL212 Josiah's Reform Christ the King Sunday	2 Kings 22:1-10 [11-20]; 23:1-3 Josiah's recovery of Scripture, reform and renewal. <i>(Luke 24:30-32)</i>
December	3	NL213 Promise of the Messiah First Sunday of Advent	Jeremiah 33:[10-11], 14-18 Promise of the Messiah <i>(Mark 8:27-29)</i>

December	31	NL219 Beginning of Good News First Sunday of Christmas	Mark 1:1-20 John the Baptist, Jesus announces the kingdom, calls the disciples. <i>(Psalm 91:9-12)</i>
January	7	NL221 Jesus Heals and Teaches Baptism of the Lord	Mark 2:1-22 Jesus heals a paralytic and eats with tax collectors. <i>(Psalm 103:6-14)</i>
January	14	NL222 Parables in Mark Second Sunday after Epiphany	Mark 4:1-34 Parables of sower and mustard seed <i>(Psalm 126)</i>

February	11	NL229 Transfiguration Transfiguration Sunday	Mark 8:27—9:8 Peter's confession, passion prediction, bearing the cross, Transfiguration. <i>(Psalm 27:1-4)</i>
February	14	NL230 Passion Prediction Ash Wednesday	Mark 9:30-37 Passion prediction, debate about who is the greatest, call to become a servant. <i>(Psalm 32:1-5)</i>
February	18	NL231 First Last and Last First First Sunday in Lent	Mark 10:17-31 Rich man is called to sell all he has and follow Jesus. <i>(Psalm 19:7-10)</i>
February	25	NL232 Bartimaeus Healed Second Sunday in Lent	Mark 10:32-52 Passion prediction, Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, heals blind Bartimaeus. <i>(Psalm 34:11-14)</i>
March	3	NL233 Parable of the Tenants [Taxes to Caesar] Third Sunday in Lent	Mark 12:1-12 [13-17] Parable of the wicked tenants; paying taxes to Caesar <i>(Psalm 86:8-13)</i>

March	28	NL237 Lord's Supper, Prayer in Gethsemane Maundy Thursday	Mark 14:22-42 Words of Institution; Peter's denial foretold; prayer in Gethsemane. <i>(Psalm 116:12-19)</i>
March	29	NL238 Crucifixion Good Friday	Mark 15:16-39 Mocking; crucifixion; "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" <i>(Psalm 22:1-2, 14-21)</i>
March	31	NL239 Resurrection Easter Sunday	Mark 16:1-8 Resurrection, empty tomb, and fleeing in fear. <i>(Psalm 118:21-27)</i>
April	7	NL240 You Shall Be My Witnesses Second Sunday of Easter	Acts 1:1-14 "You shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." <i>(Mark 6:7-13)</i>
